FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

The ICAR-Central Avian Research Institute, Izatnagar has been playing a leading role in developing technologies for application at farmers' door and revolutionizing the poultry sector to meet the challenges of sustainable nutritional and financial security of Indian farmers. The present scenario of poultry production is changing fast because of several factors *viz.* biotic and abiotic stressors, environmental and welfare concerns, changing marketing patterns, policy issues etc. Access to improved knowledge and its transformation into technology development may help in resolving these issues for helping poultry sector into economically viable and environmentally sustainable venture. The increasing costs of inputs, changing demands of consumers and booms and busts in market prices of poultry and poultry products always pose threats to producers. It is



therefore the need of hour that poultry production may need to change its dimensions and switch over to integration with other technologies like vermi composting, maggots, plants, stray cattle or small ruminants. Such type of integration may be helpful in lowering down the feed cost besides resolving the burning issue of stray cattle as well as optimizing the usage of land and resources for developing self-sustaining production system yielding higher dividends. Another advantage would be that the products coming out from such models would be almost organic with least involvement of chemicals/ antibiotics/ pesticides. With the modest beginning such model has been created at CARI, Izatnagar as a pilot project and demonstration unit for the benefit of farmers and entrepreneurs.

The institute is undertaking the research in advance areas to transform the lab research to be more sensitive and effective according to the needs of the farming community. For this, we engage ourselves in popularizing poultry farming through our extension wings by organizing training programs for farmers, industry and representatives of NGOs and imparting them the theoretical and practical knowledge of poultry production, management, health care, value-addition etc.. The specialized training programs, summer / winter schools are also being organized by the institute.

During this quarter, the institute celebrated its 41st Foundation Day in a grand manner. Specialized and regular training programs were organized. An off-campus collaborative training program for field functionaries with MANAGE, Hyderabad on, "Capacity Building of Field Functionaries on Diversified Poultry Production and Processing Technology" was organized. The kisan gosthi was organized for addressing the problems of poultry farmers. Regular activities were performed under Mera Gaon Mera Gaurav and Swachhta Abhiyan. The other programs and activities like Kisan Diwas, Gandhi Jayanti, visits of VIPs and public representative were undertaken.

IPSACON-2019 Organized at Durg

Thirty Sixth Annual Conference and National Symposium of Indian Poultry Science Association (IPSA) on "Conceptual understanding and future strategies for welfare friendly poultry production in India" was organized by College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Chhattisgarh Kamdhenu Vishwavidyalaya, Anjora, Durg (Chhattisgarh) in collaboration with Indian Poultry Science Association (IPSA) during December 11-13, 2019. This conference has provided a platform for the exchange of new ideas and novel information on the recent development in poultry sector. The Conference aimed at giving emphasis to all recent, novel and innovative research on nutrition, breeding, diseases, post-harvest technology and sustainable poultry production in view of poultry welfare in the country. It was attended by 348 researchers, policy makers, students and poultry entrepreneurs

from **24** different states of the country. Total **43 lead papers** were presented in the conference. The scientists of ICAR-CARI, Izatnagar participated actively in the conference by presenting lead papers and conducting scientific session as Chairman, Co-chairman & rapporteur. The book entitled SCIENTIFIC POULTRY PRACTICES; by Dr Mukund Kadam, Dr. Rokade Jaydip and Dr. Gautham Kolluri (ISBN no. 978-93-83397-47-1) was also released on this occasion. Dr M. Gopi, won prestigious "Avitech Young Scientist Award" and Dr Jaydip Rokade, received Best Oral Presentation Award during the event.

Backyard Poultry Integrated Model- an initiative of ICAR- CARI

A model project –cum-demonstration unit on backyard production integrated with vermi composting, maggot production, Moringa plantation, forage production (Barseem, Lobiya etc.), vegitables (Cabbage, Spinach.), Mustard etc. on one acre land was created. Total six poultry houses each with 360 sq feet area alongwith provision of perching were constructed using different materials like bamboo and thatches, iron pipe frame and fiber sheet to house about 2000 birds of different genetic groups *viz*. Kadaknath, Aseel and CARI Shyama birds. The entire area was fenced with 13 feet high fence. Five trenches (25x3x1 feet each) were constructed for earthworm production. For product of maggots of black soldier fly, five discarded overhead tanks (each with 260 L capacity) were used. The birds are allowed to graze in open field during daytime and provided with 30-40% supplemental feed in the evening while kept inside night shelters during night. The age at first egg, egg production and body weight were better in this system as compared to Desi fowl unit of the institute. Birds are maintaining good health with shining plumage and their welfare issues were also met as they graze in open field enjoying their five freedoms of welfare.

Research Highlights

Immunity, Serum Biochemical, Intestinal Morphometry and Nutrient Transporter Genes of Broiler Chickens Fed Diet Incorporated with Synbiotic

An experiment was conducted to determine the effect of synbiotic on immune response, expression of nutrient transporter genes and gut health status of broiler chickens. A total 240 day-old chicks were randomly assigned to 6 dietary treatments (5 replicates with 8 birds each) for 6 weeks. A basal diet (T_1) and the rest five test diets prepared by adding bacitracin methylene di-(BMD)@ salicylate 20mg/kg diet (T_2) . T₁+Lactobacillus acidophilus (LBA) @ 10⁶cfu + Mannan-oligosaccharides (MOS) @ 0.1% (T₃), T₁ + LBA @ 10^7 cfu + MOS@ 0.1% (T₄), T₁ + LBA $@10^6$ cfu + MOS @ 0.2% (T₅), T₁ + LBA @10⁷cfu /gm feed + MOS @ 0.2% (T₆). Haemagglutination (HA) titre and foot pad index were significantly higher in T_5 and T_6 group (Fig-1)

Significant increase (P<0.05) was observed in serum proteins, while serum enzymes viz., aspartate transaminase and (AST) transaminase (ALT), kidney function test viz., creatinine, uric acid and serum lipid profile viz., total cholesterol, high-density lipoprotein (HDL), low density lipoprotein (LDL) concentration were decreased in T₅ and T₆ group. Villus height and crypt depth were significantly increased (P<0.05) in T₅ and T₆ group. Glucose transporters-5 (GLUT5), sodium glucose transporter-1 (SGLT1) and peptide transporter-1 (PePT1) expressions in ileum were found significantly (P<0.05) upregulated in T₅ and T₆ groups at 14 d post hatch. The results of the present study led to conclusion that inclusion of synbiotic (MOS @ 0.2% and LBA @10⁶ cfu/g) in broiler diet response, improved immune biochemical parameters, intestinal morphometry and nutrient transporter genes of broiler chickens.




Fig:1- Relative fold expression of different nutrient transporter genes in the intestine (ileum) of broiler fed synbiotic

Exhibition on Diversified Poultry Production

An exhibition on diversified poultry production was organized on 2nd November, 2019 on the occasion of 41st foundation day, where in , the precious germplasm of chicken, quail, turkey and guinea fowl was displayed. All the Divisions and Sections showcased valuable technologies for the benefit of farming community.

Indigenous incubator prepared from discarded fridge was also displayed for the first time for hatching eggs in small quantity by poultry farmers himself. A live



demonstration of DAC technology for biogas generation from poultry excreta was shown to the dignitaries, poultry entrepreneurs and public. Total fourteen progressive poultry farmers were also awarded for running their poultry farms successfully with adoption of CARI technologies.
